Church Reopening for Private Prayer

Who would ever have thought it- churches closed completely for 3 months! Now as with so many things there is a cautious easing of arrangements and I'm delighted to say we feel confident about opening the church again.

In Maiden Bradley we have decided after carefully assessing the safety situation that we will open the church for private prayer on Sunday and Wednesday from approximately 10-4. The area set aside is the Lady Chapel to the front and left of the church and there will be hand sanitisers and clear instructions as you enter the church.

The only seating will be in the chapel – please don't use the pews. There will be a sign on the seat which we ask you to turn over to indicate that no one else should sit there. This is really important as the virus has been passed on by using a chair from a Covid sufferer within even 6 hours.

We really want to keep you safe as you worship and are so looking forward to opening our doors again. We haven't got a clear idea of when we can gather for full services yet but we can hold small funerals. We will keep the frequency of our opening under constant review.

I hope you have been able to stay hopeful during the stringent times of lockdown. I like Henri Nouwen's thoughts on this from *Here and Now*. Joy and hope are never separate he says. Wishes and happiness on the other hand usually refer to things and events. I wish it would stop raining then I'd be happy again. Hope and joy are spiritual gifts, for we hope in God and rejoice in his presence even when your wishes are not realised and you are not very happy with the circumstances of your life. On the 6th June 1944 Britain was at war with Germany,

It was also Colin Dowson's birthday.....

Moving on 76 years Covid-19 is also having a war like hold over the country, but adhering to government guidelines, and maintaining social distancing a small number of people from the church met outside Colin's house to wish him a happy birthday and present him with a water colour print of a section of the village including the pub and his house. This was in recognition for all the work and help Colin has given over many years.

Colin was born in Maiden Bradley, and spent the very early years of his life in 2 other houses in the village. He moved with his parents to his current house at the age of about 18months.

Colin's contribution to the church started in the churchyard whilst at school, helping to cut the grass originally with a scythe and hook. He continued this, with more modern machinery, for many years and stopped when things became too difficult. As a boy he was in the church choir, he also pumped the organ in the loft at the chapel. Inside the church, he helped his father keep the church boiler running, which for Colin meant collecting the coke in a wheelbarrow. There are hand rails which Colin fabricated to assist those who were a little unsteady, one at the chancel steps, and one outside leading to the churchyard. In 1973 he took over the decoration of the Christmas tree from his father and with help from others, continued this activity up until 2 years ago. Colin is an excellent bell ringer and has rung the bells at Maiden Bradley for many years only stopping when climbing the tower steps to the ringing chamber became too painful. His contribution to others who have rung in the tower has been very encouraging, and he would always offer good advice where needed, and would say it as it was!

In the 60's he was scout leader, when cubs and scouts were strongly supported in the village. He had a varied career, among other jobs working for Geoffrey Luff at Perry Farm. Having a love for horses he eventually went and trained at Hereford College and became a very accomplished farrier and blacksmith. Colin was a very respected farrier by horse owners due to his quiet calm approach to the animals.

The timing of this meeting was primarily for his birthday, and it was thought at the time to be in conjunction with his leaving the village. At this moment in time Colin is still not sure when, or if this is going to happen. All that can be said is, when his move takes place he will be greatly missed. When that time arrives and he has settled in, it would be a great asset to the village if he could put pen to paper and offer his wealth of knowledge and stories he has collected over the years.

News Update - Shear Water and Heaven's Gate

Following calls from parishioners regarding the high volume of visitors at Shear Water and Heaven's Gate causing concern that the emergency services might not be able to get through to the village, the Parish Council have been in contact with the Rural Policing Team. See their reply below:

"The Rural Policing Team go through Shearwater a few times each shift so they are aware of the issues at Shearwater and Heaven's Gate with traffic and visitors to the area. The Rural Policing Team have spoken to Wiltshire Council Highways to discuss the Clearway that is in place that starts in the village and runs for a mile way past the end of the lake itself.

The clearway was decriminalised in the year 2000 making it a civil offence to park on the Clearway and as such Wiltshire Police cannot enforce it for this reason. If a vehicle is completely off the road then this is not considered an offence, but if they are half on the carriageway and half off, then this is an infringement and an Enforcement Officer (what was a traffic warden) can write them out a ticket. The clearway must be marked by a start and an end sign and DOES NOT require any white lines being painted on the road and as such is correctly marked in situ at present.

It seems that Enforcement Officers have not been in operation during Covid-19 but are now restarting on Monday 1st June 2020. The Rural Policing Team have asked that they attend the Shearwater Lake so enforcement can be started.

Since Lockdown has been eased slightly, it was always inevitable that once people were allowed to go out with less restriction they would visit in greater numbers due to the close proximity to Warminster, but also people maybe not wanting to visit beaches on the south coast with all the crowding we have seen on social media. Warminster Officers have been engaging and educating members of the public at Shearwater and removed a number of groups from the lake during the day and car park in the evening.

With current Covid-19 restrictions, members of the public are able to visit the lake freely as many times as they wish to exercise, have a picnic as a family, or just sit by the lake. Wiltshire Police will still engage with members of the public about Covid 19, but they are not able to enforce Social Distancing as they do in Scotland and Wales."

I want to start this month by stating that this page is not meant to be preachy... most of you are probably doing lots of the things mentioned already and have your own brilliant ideas/solutions. The hope is just to keep the conversation going so that we do not let these vital issues slide down the agenda of our lives.

Having had lots of time at home many of us have probably been sorting things out in a way that we could only have dreamed of when we made those new-year's resolutions a few months back!

For years charity shops have provided us with a great way to move things on but currently this is not necessarily the answer. Now that the retail shops are able to open again charity shops may have part

of their income stream back but this is a quote from a charity shop manager:

"Probably only 30% of the items I get donated are fit to sell. Worn, torn, filthy and not even fit for rags in a lot of cases. Overseas markets have dried up, West Africa doesn't need wool sweaters, they have warehouses of them. If you wouldn't buy it yourself don't give it to charity, it costs us to dispose of it which rather defeats the object of charitable donations."

In other words, the countries where the UK sent its waste textiles no longer want them as the 'rag trade' system has broken down due to C19. This means that we need to be as re-sponsible as we can when we dispose of things especially to charity shops. Last month I heard about a bag of baby & children's clothes. We split them between two families we knew who were having babies. This shortened chain that knows the end results is helpful. Facebook is useful in this way, not just the village page but a much wider audience in the local 'marketplace' sections. There will be many other solutions and the main thing is to try to be aware of the consequences of the actions that we take and where possible to find local answers rather than ones that depend on systems that may or may not still be functioning successfully. Perhaps when we are allowed to we should have a good old fashioned village jumble sale?

COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH NEWS

Police Community Volunteers working on behalf of
the Wiltshire Police and Maiden Bradley



Welcome to Community Speed Watch News, compiled and produced by the Maiden Bradley Community Speed Watch Volunteers to keep the village aware of our activities.

With the possible easing of lockdown restriction plans are being put in place for the CSW teams to resume activities hopefully in the second week of July.

In the meantime the Police have been very active in the area including visiting Maiden Bradley when 3 offenders were booked speeding through the village.

The Community Policing Teams have been working hard to provide visible speed enforcement across the county. Since 19th April we have deployed targeted speed enforcement operations on 219 occasions, which equates to approximately 4/5 sessions per day. Of these sessions 209 have been conducted on local and village roads. We have issued 36 drivers with fixed penalty notices and 37 drivers have been reported directly to court.

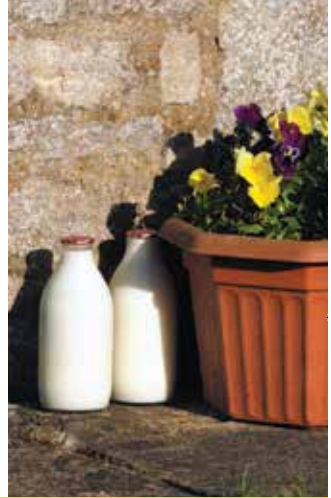
