Highways - The Parish Council also wish to thank publicly Parishioner Giles de Mare for the work actioned in Church Street that was the Parish Stewards remit; he had felt that whilst waiting for the scheme to restart the work would just increase the degeneration of the Highway. Council wish publicly, to thank him for all the hard work he has actioned for the benefit of the Community.

The Forces March Group - have donated £100.00 to the Village Shop, they had offered to make a donation to the Community following the use to the recreational area. The Parish Council were only to pleased that they had chosen to have the donation made to the shop, as the shop subsequently had the chiller breakdown and the donation was put to good use.

SID Pole Project- the Parish Council is awaiting for the metal poles to be installed to enable the two Speed Indicator units gifted to the Warminster Area from Wiltshire Council to be installed at regular intervals through the year, alerting drivers to their speed etc. The scheme has now started in Warminster and is being seen as proactive in the areas it is deployed.

For the Chocolate Meringue Base

6 large egg whites
300 grams caster sugar
3 tablespoons cocoa powder (sieved)
1 teaspoon balsamic vinegar (or red wine vinegar)
50 grams dark chocolate (finely chopped)

For the Topping

500 millilitres double cream
500 grams raspberries
3 tablespoons dark chocolate (coarsely grated)

Method

Preheat the oven to 180°C/gas mark 4/350°F and line a baking tray with baking parchment.

Beat the egg whites until satiny peaks form, and then beat in the sugar a spoonful at a time until the meringue is stiff and shiny. Sprinkle over the cocoa and vinegar, and the chopped chocolate. Then gently fold everything until the cocoa is thoroughly mixed in. Mound on to a baking sheet in a fat circle approximately 23cm / 9 inches in diameter, smoothing the sides and top. Place in the oven, then immediately turn the temperature down to 150°C/gas mark 2/300°F and cook for about one to one and a quarter hours. When it's ready it should look crisp around the edges and on the sides and be dry on top, but when you prod the centre you should feel the promise of squidginess beneath your fingers. Turn off the oven and open the door slightly, and let the chocolate meringue disc cool completely.

When you're ready to serve, invert on to a big, flat-bottomed plate. Whisk the cream till thick but still soft and pile it on top of the meringue, then scatter over the raspberries. Coarsely grate the chocolate so that you get curls rather than rubble, as you don't want the raspberries' luscious colour and form to be obscured, and sprinkle haphazardly over the top, letting some fall, as it will, on the plate's rim.

Chocolate Raspberry Meringue

Serves: 8-10
