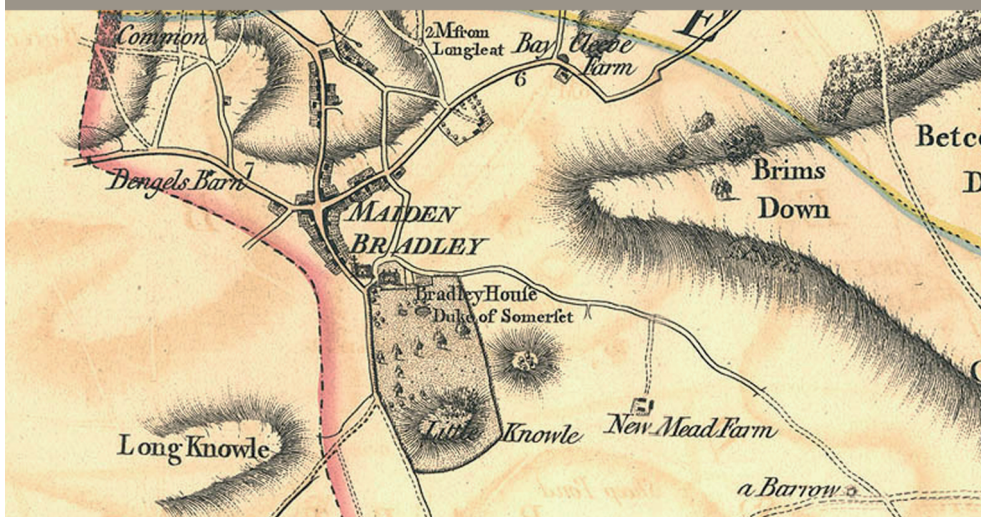

## **Mere and District Link Scheme Report to Maiden Bradley Parish Council 2018**

The Mere and District Link Scheme is a charity operated by volunteers to help transport people in Mere and surrounding villages to medical and other appointments. We would like to thank the Parish Council for its continued support.

In 2017 we did 1,074 journeys, covering 39,343 miles. Our volunteers gave 2,079 hours of their time and we have done 395 journeys in the first four months of 2018. Around 10% of journeys are for clients from Maiden Bradley. We have a total of 35 drivers and 4 non driving volunteers who work as co-ordinators and committee members. I am pleased to report that taking a stall at the Maiden Bradley produce show last summer has led to three new drivers and we will be present at other shows this summer as new drivers are always welcome.

Included in this mileage are the regular dosette box runs that we undertake to deliver medicines to patients of both Mere and Silton Surgeries each Friday. This is a huge benefit for the surgeries and patients alike.

Although our main focus is medical appointments we do consider other "wellness" requests. For instance, we transport people to the Grove Building in Mere fortnightly for the regular Friends Together meeting. However, these other journeys will not be undertaken at the expense of medical appointments.

As a registered Charity the Link Scheme does not have set charges for the journeys undertaken. Clients are invited to make whatever donation they can afford. We have heard that some people say they cannot afford the Link and if you hear anyone saying this please try to make the situation clear to them.

Financially, we are sound at the moment but the donations we receive from clients don't cover our costs (drivers give their time for free but are paid 45p per mile) so we rely on the monies raised by the Literary Festival, which is our main fundraising event each year, to make ends meet. Adrienne Howell, who set up the festival and will run it for the 22<sup>nd</sup> time this year between 8 and 14 October, has decided it is time for her to step down. We cannot express our gratitude enough for Adrienne's contribution to the Link but, as she says, "we need someone younger to take on and develop the Literary Festival and help secure the Link Scheme's future". If you or anyone you know is interested in taking on this vital role please let me know.

A couple of pointers on how we operate – our co-ordinators are volunteers working in their own homes so we ask people to call between 9am-5pm Monday to Friday. Also, the Link is not a taxi or emergency response service so we ask for 2 working days notice wherever possible.

Finally, all welcome at our AGM on Friday 1 June at 7pm in the Grove Building. Our guest speakers are the pearly King and Queen of Harrow who now live in Mere.

Thank you again for your continued support.

Andy and Lyn would like to thank everyone for the warm welcome we have received from the village since taking over The Somerset Arms in January.

We came here after running The Duke pub in Bratton for seven years, which we thoroughly enjoyed. After taking a year out of the trade we decided it was time to go back to what we liked the most, a beautiful village pub in the centre of the community.

We have plenty of amenities for everyone to use and enjoy. We have 5 ensuite letting rooms that your friends and family can book, for if you don't have the space or the inclination.

We also have a skittle alley which can also be used to hold parties or even a business function. The Boules pitch is now back in use thanks to the Roche's hard work. The garden is coming along with plenty of seating, there is a large area that the children are using to play in.

We are happy to cater for weddings, funerals, christenings, birthdays etc. we have two marquees, a hog roast and a BBQ all of which can be utilized or hired out. We welcome well behaved dogs, and you can eat either in the bar, garden or in the little dining area.



The menu is all homemade fresh to order, with allergy free a speciality. Tuesday night is Steak Night with 2 steaks and a bottle of wine for £25. We serve traditional Sunday roasts 12-3pm, booking is advisable. We serve food Tuesday-Thursday 12pm-2.30pm and 6pm-9pm, and Friday and Saturday 12pm -9pm.

We currently have two real ales on, with more planned in the future. We have a choice of wines, spirits and soft drinks available. The Pub is open Tuesday –Thursday 12pm-2.30pm, and 6pm -11pm. Friday and Saturday 12pm-12midnight. Sunday we are open 12pm -10.30pm. We are closed on Mondays until 6pm except for Bank Holidays.

Friday nights we have HI 5 Poker from 8pm, anyone can play. £5 entry, and a chance to go on to the National finals for a grand prize of £60000. Don't worry if you don't play we can teach you.

Easter Monday we had our first Tractors and Trotters event. Some 15-20 tractors took part in a 10 mile run around the lanes. Thanks to Mr Stephens for his help in organising it. On the return we had a Hog roast in the Skittle alley and live music in the bar. Thanks to everybody who supported this and we raised £270.00 for The Wiltshire Air Ambulance.

## Parish Council May 2018

Council voted in **Councillor Angus Neish as Chairman** for the Civic year and **Councillor Patrick Nixon as the Vice Chairman**. The following was also resolved:

**Staffing Committee** – Vice Chairman and two other Councillors: Councillor Patrick Nixon, Councillor Susanna Brigden and Councillor Sebastian Seymour would make up the Staffing Committee.

**Planning Committee** – Full Council to discuss planning there would not be a separate Planning Committee meeting.

**The Parish Representative for each of the below was approved:**

**Highways Representative** – to liaise with the Highways Community Co-ordinator (Parish Steward Contact) and attend Community Action Tasking Group meetings when necessary. Councillor Sebastian Seymour would take over this role, Councillor Patrick Nixon would pass on the contact details of Parish Steward to him.

**Rights of Way Representative** – to advise Council and work with the Wiltshire Council Team on the up keep of the rights of way within the parish. Councillor Angus Neish would remain as the Rights of Way Representative.

**Tree Warden** - to advise Council and work with the Wiltshire Council Team on the up keep of the trees within the parish. Peter Oliver would remain as the Tree Warden.

**Village Hall Representative** - to sit on the Village Hall Committee as the Councils Representative from the Community. This requirement is set in the Village Hall Constitution. Councillor Susanna Brigden would be the Parish Councils Representative.

**Neighbourhood Watch Representative** – to work with the Rural Policing Team and attend Neighbourhood Tasking Group meetings. Dereck Stevens would continue as the Neighbourhood Watch Representative.

**Community Emergency Volunteer** – to be the designated contact should an incident take. They will be required to update the Community Emergency Plan as and when necessary. Councillor Patrick Nixon would continue as the Community Emergency Volunteer co-ordinating the Community.

**Grant Awarding Co-ordinator** – to work with groups and clubs when applications are sought. It was agreed in her absence that Councillor Poppy Wilcox would take up this position.

**Standing Orders** (Councils Rules and Regulations) - Council viewed the draft Standing Orders the National Association of Local Councils have recommended to cover the changes in the law. Council approved the amendments recommended and will approve them for use at its June meeting.

**Highways** - If any Parishioner sees or is aware of anything which they feel needs attention in and around the parish highways, they are requested to contact Wiltshire Council using either the online website above, the Wiltshire Council App or on the landline number **0300 456 0105**.

**Painting of the Church Railings** – Sadly no one came forward so the repainting of the Church Railings has been placed on hold.



**Date of the next meeting-** The Council agreed that **Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> June 2018** would be the date of the next Parish Council meeting.

As always, the Parish Council meeting will be open at the start with an opportunity for members of the public to ask questions or make comments on any matter. 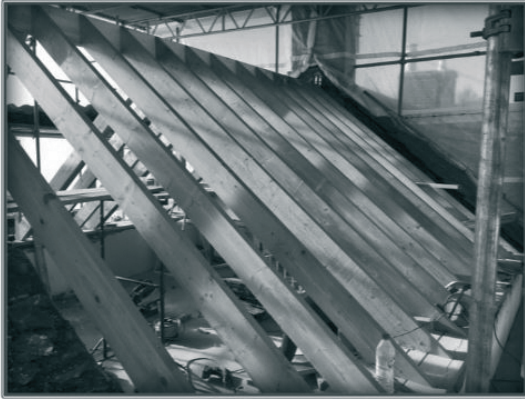

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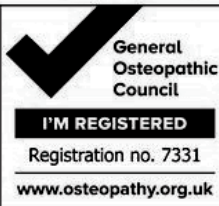

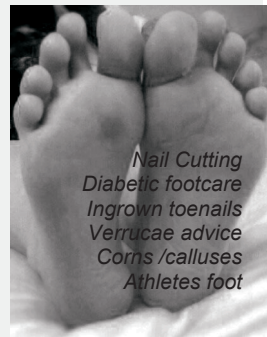
