Progress Report from the Friends of Maiden Bradley Church

The Friends was set up 4 years ago to help raise money to look after our beautiful Grade 1 listed church in the village. Over the last year we have managed to buy a new lawn mower for the churchyard, complete some much-needed work to the large stain glass window, and do some re-pointing work on the Tower. In total the Friends has spent £3240 on various essential work on the church, just this year alone.

In the future we are hoping to get the clock restored, although need more donations before this can go ahead. We are also looking at some restoration on the organ, which is suffering from bat damage as well as some decay.

We have been very fortunate in receiving a couple of large donations over the last few years, as well as having some regular givers. We also raise money through Easy Fundraising (which raises funds through online shopping). This is such an easy way of raising money -please consider signing up – the companies you are buying from donate the money – you don't have to pay anything! I am happy to help anyone set it up.

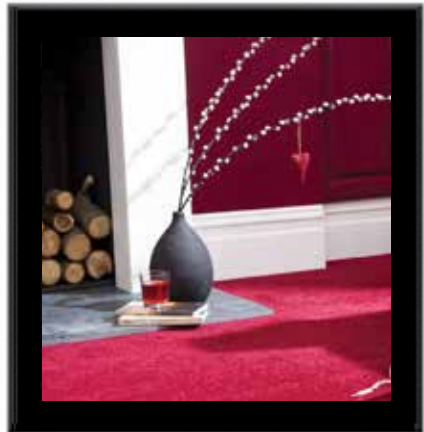

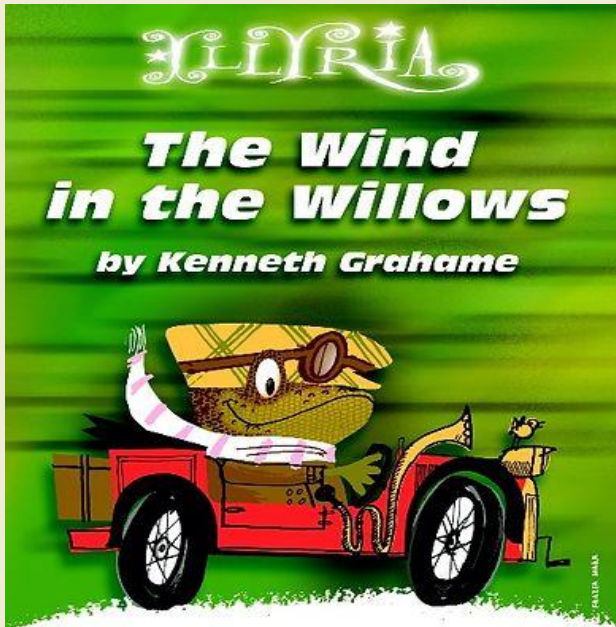

BIRDS & INSECTS

Sue Loudoun moved to Maiden Bradley in 2002 & her space was basically just a bare rectangle. She is now 92 & still does all the work on her incredible creation herself. As you can see from this white rose, insects prefer simple open flowers to the highly cultivated ones with many layers of petals meaning that they cannot easily find their way to the nectar. Scientists report a huge reduction in the numbers of insects that are splattered on car windscreens since the 1970s (do you remember how often we needed to go & scrape them off?). Insects may be a nuisance but they are all part of the network of life that we adjust at our peril, yes even the pesky wasps that have been attacking the new bees at the Community Garden.

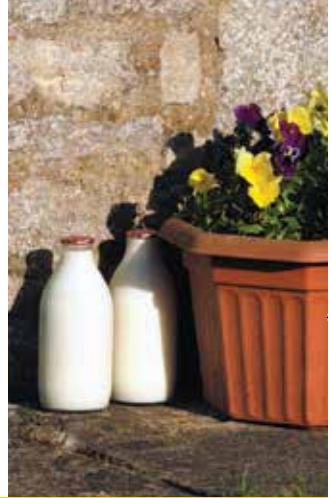
