

#### OUR FRIEND LEN

Len Cooper, a very good friend and fellow shoot member to many of us in Maiden Bradley, sadly died on 4th October Len first came to Maiden Bradley in 1958 when he married Sylvia. They lived for a while at number 49 Church Street while working on his father's farm at Norton Ferris. When the farm could no longer support two families, Len bought a lorry and hauled stone from the Mendips. Len and Sylvia built themselves a bungalow at Kilmington Common. They have three children, Michael, Susan and Margaret. In the early 1970's they returned to Maiden Bradley joining Sylvia's father running Leathers Coaches. Under Len's control the coach business blossomed and at one time having as many as ten coaches.

Len was a perfectionist, no matter what time of night coaches returned they were washed and cleaned before being put away. Len also maintained the fleet to a very high standard. Len and Sylvia sold the company in 1998. Len was keen on both shooting and Cley pigeon shooting and in about 1990 Chip Cottage Shoot was formed where about 20 members, many from Maiden Bradley, enjoyed almost thirty years game shooting. Len took on the role of secretary and treasurer. His bookkeeping was immaculate and record keeping, second to none. When asked how many birds were shot on a particular day, many years before and it was all in his records. From his many friends in Maiden Bradley and the Chip Cottage Shoot, we thank you Len, rest in peace.



#### A Happy Man No. 6



The Memories of a Railway Man

An Autobiography by Mike Herrin and his life on the railway.

Yeovil Junction Part Two.

I started work in Yeovil Junction, I think, in 1959, as time goes by, dates don't seem to mean too much and exact times are lost. The work was very different to that at Crewkerne, We were more involved with the transhipment of parcels from main line trains to the branch to Yeovil Town and there were vast amounts of parcels moved by rail back then, mountains of mailbags, tobacco products etc. All Woolworth' (The late lamented) goods moved by rail, we only dealt with the small products, wagon load traffic went to Yeovil Town and Hendford goods, of which more later.

There was a Booking Clerk, Foreman, and three porters per shift, (Early and Late) on the various turns of each shift in the yard. In the yard were a Head Shunter and two under shunters, a carriage and wagon examiner per shift. Plus a night shunter, 6 signalmen in two boxes and a lampman on days. The Signam and Telegraph Dept: and two mechanical signal engineers, add the tack men to the pot and you can see that there was unlike today usually someone about the place. I forgot to add the seventeen guards based there and the continuous stream of loco men coming and going to change crews on many of the trains.

Instead of going through the routine days let us take a look at one or two of the amusing incidents that happened.







One of our gang was in the habit of going to Sherborne, next station up the line, about once a fortnight on lates for a haircut. He lived in a lineside cottage up the line and used to ride his bicycle to work along the "Cess", a narrow path alongside the ballast, no longer around. Back then you were able to cycle from Penzance to Wick along a well maintained path and banks.

After his haircut he used to visit the local for a pint, on this occasion he visited the Yeovil Junction Buffet during the evening and had another. About 8:30pm the foreman decides to let him go home a bit early so he sets off up the line on his trusty bike, we thought nothing more about it, until the 8:50pm Up Bideford express goods roars through at about 60 mph, up into the cutting on towards Sherborne the engine whistle long and loud, then we hear her open up again accelerating away, all seems well.

#### MAIDEN BRADLEY WEIGHT WATCHERS - UPDATE



In last month's newsletter we updated you on our plans to get a Temporary Traffic Regulation Order (TTRO) for the B3092 to try to reduce the weight and size of the HGV traffic in Maiden Bradley. Lorries of up to 45 tonnes use our village as a cut through to and from the A303 instead of driving on the A350 and the Frome and Warminster bypasses which were built specifically for large and heavy vehicles.

A meeting was held on 10th November with the Wiltshire Area Board at which our proposal for a

TTRO, outlined in the November edition of the Maiden Bradley News, was explained in detail by Alex Channer who spoke on behalf of the villagers of Maiden Bradley, Chapmanslade and Corsley.

Alex spoke eloquently and assertively, convincing the Councillors to support our motion for a TTRO. Councillor Clewer, the leader of Wiltshire Council was very supportive, noting that the matter would be discussed further and that a new highways officer has been appointed to "shake things up a bit".

We intend to maintain the pressure on Wiltshire Council at our next meeting in early December which will be chaired by our MP, Dr. Andrew Murrison.

Police Community Volunteers working on behalf of the Wiltshire Police and Maiden Bradley



Community Speed Watch News. Produced by the Maiden Bradley Community Speed Watch Volunteers to keep the village safe and aware of our activities.

Ill health, Holidays, Inclement weather, Road Works in the area plus the very positive effect of the SID on Frome Road has made CSW activity in November impossible for the much reduced active members of the CSW team. Therefore by majority vote we have decided to stop operations until the 9th January 2023. When we will commence.

The decision is further compounded by the reduction in volunteers to take part in CSW operations all for fair and honourable reasons. We started operations in 2018 with 17 volunteers. Four years later we are down to 7 active members with three CSW sessions a week. A lot of extra time is spent by the very willing few on CSW duties. I for one am very grateful for all the hard work and effort put by CSW team members both past and present. Thank you.

The undoubted success of the SID (Speed Indicator Device) on Frome Road. has had such a positive effect in traffic calming and therefore quite rightly as expected changed the pattern of CSW activity.

So much so that a second one of the same type has been agreed by the Council for the church end of the village along with other improvements to the traffic calming in that area.

So you see it's even more important that we gain volunteers to spread the load rather than just the active seven members carrying out CSW duties. It's only 45 minutes every fortnight in good company. Think about it and help spread the load for CSW.,

We as you will have noted, taking a short sabbatical from CSW and will return to activity on the week commencing 9th January 2023

#### Police and Crime Commissioner Philip Wilkinson's Column

Policing has been under the microscope in the last year and I don't see this scrutiny letting up any time soon – and neither should it.

The public want their police force to keep them safe, protect vulnerable people, put victims first, catch the criminals responsible, produce quality investigations and lock the bad ones up.

Wiltshire Police has had its fair share of criticism. It has received a poor PEEL inspection report and is currently in 'special measures'. I can reassure you progress is being made and my scrutiny of that performance is ongoing.

We have had some solid successes too. You told me road safety and speeding was a key concern. I have committed investment into the roads policing unit, increasing the number of officers and cars by 20%.

We also tripled the capacity of the speed enforcement team, with extra police staff and state-of-the-art cameras. With this joined up approach, there are more traffic officers on our streets and there has been an increase of 42% of the number of people caught speeding and given tickets. There is still more to do but our roads will become safer as the deterrent of speeding tickets and prosecution starts to bite.

The rural crime team has also doubled since I committed investment in the team and in extra equipment. I was also pleased with the force's commitment to visit all victims of home burglary – let me know if this doesn't happen and I will act on your behalf to scrutinise that commitment.

We are also in the process of recruiting the next Chief Constable of Wiltshire Police and I hope to have them confirmed in post by mid January. We look forward to welcoming them to the county. In the meantime, our current Chief will carry on implementing the improvements needed to satisfy HM Inspectors and provide stability so the force can continue making Wiltshire safer for all.

Please also make sure you take part in my survey, taking place in December and January, which will ask you about your confidence levels in Wiltshire Police and about the policing precept for 2023/24. It is important we capture as many people's thoughts as possible and you will find this on my website from mid December.
